## How to make a COMPlaint

Adams County encourages neighbors to work out problems personally and in a civil manner. However, if this does not work, you can contact Adams County Animal Management to make a formal complaint. An animal management officer will investigate and, if warranted, issue a written warning documenting the date, time, and nature of the noise complaint.



If the problem persists after the written warning, a summons and complaint may be issued for noise violations that have occurred a week after the original warning. To issue a summons, at least two witnesses from separate households must sign the complaint. A single witness is required to sign the complaint if credible evidence of the violation is provided or an animal management officer or deputy sheriff also observes the violation.

### How to keep your dog from barking

Pet owners have the responsibility to make sure their dogs are not a nuisance in their community. Here are some suggestions to curtail nuisance barking:

> WOOF WOOF

- Bring your dog indoors if it barks while outside.
- 🖐 Reward your dog when it stops barking.
- Find out what your dog is barking at, and remove it, if possible.
- 🖐 Use an anti-bark collar on your dog.
- Try an obedience class or other professional training with your dog.



In Adams County, barking, howling, or any other unreasonable animal noise is prohibited. We realize that dogs bark on occasion, so a single instance is not grounds for a complaint. However, you can enter a complaint if you encounter a dog that barks, howls, yelps, whines, or makes noise audible beyond the premises.













For a consecutive period of over 20 minutes during the day – 7 a.m. to 9 p.m.

#### **10**<sup>+</sup> minutes / 9 p.m. to 7 a.m.

For a consecutive period of over 10 minutes during the night – 9 p.m. to 7 a.m.

#### 120<sup>+</sup> minutes / 24-hour period

For a cumulative period in excess of 120 minutes during any 24-hour period
