## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Q. When must my voted mail-in ballot be returned?**

**A.** Mail-in ballots must be RECEIVED at the Adams County Elections Office or Designated Drop-off/Service Center sites by 7pm on Election Day in order for your vote(s) to be counted. Ballots received after 7pm on Election Day will not be counted.

**Q. Where can I drop-off my mail-in ballot?**

**A.** There are fourteen Drop-off sites, listed below, conveniently located around the county.

**Q. How can I tell if I am registered to vote or if my voted mail-in ballot has been received?**

**A.** To verify your mail-in ballot was received by the Elections Office, visit the website at [www.govotecolorado.com](http://www.govotecolorado.com), clicking on the "Find My Registration" link.

**Q. What shall I do if I want to vote at a polling place, but I received a mail-in ballot?**

**A.** You may surrender your mail-in ballot at an Early Voting site and vote on a touch screen voting machine. This function cannot be done on Election Day.

**Q. What do I do if I make a mistake, damage or lose my ballot?**

**A.** You may request a Replacement Ballot by visiting one of the conveniently located Service Centers listed below.

**Q. Who are the eligible Write-in Candidates?**

**A.** Visit [www.adamscountyelections.org](http://www.adamscountyelections.org) for the list.

**Q. I've heard that mail-in ballots are only counted if there are close races. Is that true?**

**A.** No. All ballots, both polling place and mail-in, are counted in the same manner. All valid mail-in ballots are counted in every election in Colorado, regardless of the outcome or closeness of any race.

**Q. Are ADA accessible voting machines available?**

**A.** ADA accessible voting machines are available during Early Voting and on Election Day. For more information, please contact the Adams County Elections Office at 720-523-6500.
