#### **IV. CJCC Strategic Priorities**

- Meeting Frequency Discussion
  - Brian opened discussion on CJCC's purpose as a problem-solving body addressing systemic issues in the 17th Judicial District.
  - Concern raised about low attendance at subcommittee meetings and overall meeting frequency.
  - General support for transitioning to quarterly board meetings due to low attendance.
  - Importance of maintaining purposeful and meaningful meetings.

- Subcommittees encouraged to maintain ongoing communication between meetings.
- Ensuring quorum attendance, particularly judicial leadership, was noted as important.
- Motion passed to move CJCC board meetings to a quarterly schedule, with a mechanism to add meetings if necessary.
  
- Subcommittee Strategic Priorities
  - **Juvenile Justice-Commissioner O’Dorisio:**
    - Ongoing development of a system-wide map (inputs, outputs, processes).
    - Strong survey participation; aim to identify missing stakeholders.
    - Proposed shift in focus from “JJ Firearm Violence” to “JJ Offending.”
  
  - **Alternative Sanctions-Chief Judge Seedorf:**
    - Strong attendance and engagement.
    - Restorative Justice (RJ) identified as a key priority.
    - Group seeking a more defined focus moving forward.
  
  - **Behavioral Health-Commissioner Pinter:**
    - Recommendation to remove detox facility as priority.
    - Continue to focus on competency, mentoring behavioral health funding changes, and legislative updates.
  
  - **Crime Prevention, Intervention, and Re-Entry-Sheriff Claps:**
    - Ongoing use of juvenile and county-level data
    - For re-entry, efforts are currently paused pending selection of a polling firm related to a jail initiative. This has been identified as an ongoing priority.
    - More work in intervention has been proposed as a priority area, particularly tied to re-entry efforts.

## V. CJCC Updates

- Restorative Justice
  - Identified as an initiative for the Alternative Sanctions Subcommittee
- Adding Competency Workgroup every other month
  - Identified to support overlap between Alternative Sanctions and Behavioral Health to ensure the conversations are not duplicated between subcommittees.
- Review By Laws

- Review to ensure compliance and make any recommended updates regarding quorum.
